SUNDAY SCHOOL INSTITUTE.

The Church Sunday-School Institute of the Diocese of West Missouri.

We, the undersigned, clergy, officers and teachers of the Church Sunday Schools in the Diocese of West Missouri, under the Godly counsel of our Bishop, and imploring the aid of Almighty God, do hereby organize an association for the purpose of securing greater efficiency in our Sunday School work, and accordingly adopt for our guidance the following:

CONSTITUTION.

1. NAME.

The name of this association shall be the Church Sunday School Institute of the Diocese of West Missouri.

2. OBJECT.

The object of this Institute shall be to associate clergymen, teachers and others interested in Sunday School work; to provide opportunities for consultation as to the best means of carrying on Sunday Schools, and generally to promote the efficiency of this branch of church work throughout the Diocese.

3. MEMBERSHIP.

The privileges of membership shall be open to all the clergy, to the officers and teachers of the Sunday Schools of the Church, and to all others desiring to further its objects, in the Diocese of West Missouri, and such membership shall be formally assumed by the signing of this constitution.

4. OFFICERS.

The officers of this Institute shall be a President, a First and Second Vice-President, and a Secretary, who shall also act as Treasurer; and these officers, with five or more other members, shall constitute an Executive Committee.

The Bishop of the Diocese shall be President *ex officio*, and shall have power to appoint the other officers named above to serve until the first annual meeting. These officers shall thereafter be elected by ballot at the annual meeting of the Institute; and the Bishop shall have the power to appoint the other members of the Executive Committee.

5. EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

During the intervals between the annual meetings, full authority to act for the Institute shall be vested in the Executive Committee, three of whom, at any meeting regularly called, shall constitute a quorum. They shall have power to fill vacancies, to frame by-laws for the direction of the Institute and its officers, to appoint the annual and other meetings, and to arrange the details of such convocations, institutes, lectures, normal instructions and teachers' meetings as they shall undertake to provide. The officers of the Executive Committee shall be the same as those of the Institute, and its transactions shall be recorded in the same book of minutes with those of the Institute itself.

6. MEETINGS.

There shall be an Annual Sunday School Convention and Teachers' Institute each year. The sessions of this convocation shall close with the annual meeting of the Institute.

Besides this there shall be local or parochial teachers' institutes each year. At these the following order of business shall be observed:

1. Brief religious services.
2. Reading of papers.
3. Discussion of same.
4. Opening of question box.
5. If possible, a model training lesson.

7. AMENDMENTS.

This constitution may be amended at any annual meeting by a two-thirds vote of members present, notice of said amendment having been given to the Executive Committee at least thirty days previous.

BY-LAWS.

1. The President shall preside at all meetings of the Institute or Executive Committee, appoint committees, and perform such other duties as appertain to said office.
2. One of the Vice-Presidents shall perform the duties of the President during his absence or inability to act.
3. The Secretary shall keep all records of meetings of the Institute or Executive Committee, and perform such other duties as may be delegated to him.
4. The Treasurer shall collect all moneys due the Institute, and pay out same on order of Executive Committee.
5. Meetings of the Executive Committee shall be held on the second Tuesday of each month of the year, excepting months of July, August and September.
6. Special meetings may be called by the Bishop, by the President of the Institute, or by the Executive Committee.

 3. Report of Secretary.
 4. Report of Treasurer.
 5. Reports of standing committees.
 6. Reports of special committees.
 7. Unfinished business.

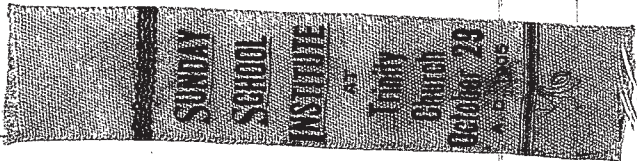
